

National Goodwill Week May 5 through May 11

Steve Allen and Jayne Meadows will serve as co-chairmen of National Goodwill Week which will be observed May 5th through the 11th. This year's theme is GOODWILL... A NATIONAL PRIORITY... HELPING THE HANDICAPPED HELP THEMSELVES.

The week is observed annually to recognize and honor handicapped persons who have successfully overcome individual disabilities through training received at one of the 154 Goodwill centers across the U.S.A.

Locally, the Lancaster Goodwill has several events

slated for Goodwill Week, according to Norman L. Schell, president of the Lancaster Goodwill. Opening the week will be Goodwill Sunday, with many churches in Lancaster County taking part through special services or collections.

Lancaster Mayor Richard Scott will tour the Goodwill rehabilitation facility at 1048 N. Plum St., Lancaster on Monday morning May 6 at 8:00 a.m. to officially begin weeklong Open House activities. The mayor will also sign a proclamation for Goodwill Week in Lancaster at that time.

Open House will be conducted at the Lancaster Goodwill facilities at 1048 N. Plum St., Lancaster from 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Monday thru Friday, May 6-10. Everyone is invited to tour the workshop facilities as well as view a display of trophies and presentations made to Joyce Burkholder of the Lancaster Goodwill. Joyce is National Goodwill Worker of 1973, and has toured the nation during the past year as the official ambassador of all member Goodwill centers.

A Goodwill Spring Fashion Show will be held in the Goodwill retail store at 28 W. King St., Lancaster on May 10 at 7:00 p.m. Models will fashion numerous spring outfits donated to Goodwill by local retail stores and

individual contributors.

Culminating Goodwill Week will be Lancaster Goodwill's 2nd Banquet held on Saturday evening, May 11 at 6:30 p.m. at the Lancaster Catholic High School. Awards of appreciation will be presented to various media and volunteers who have given their time and services to Goodwill during 1973. Guest speaker for the evening will be Dean Phillips, National Executive Director of Goodwill Industries of America, Inc.

Store sales at all four Goodwill stores in Lancaster, Manheim, Ephrata, and East Earl will run throughout Goodwill Week. Items from clothing to furniture will be on sale, with fantastic savings on Friday and Saturday especially.

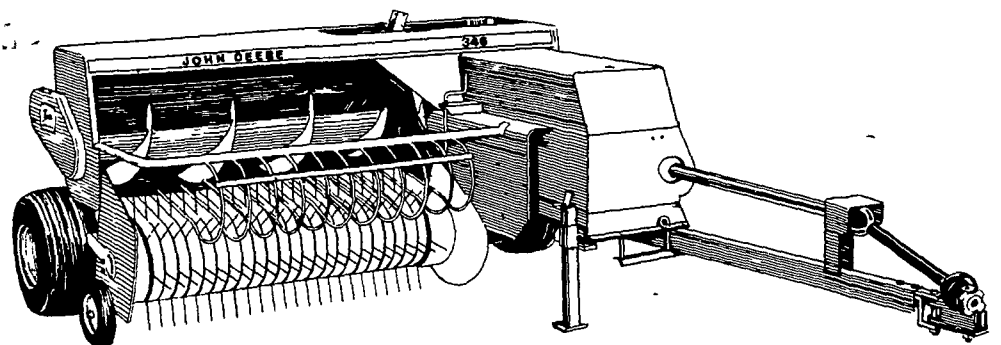
