Guaranteed loans by banks and other lending agencies are a new scorce of credit for farmers who cannot otherwise find financial assistance, Roy H. Giesmann, FmHA County Supervisor for Lancaster and Chester counties said

"FmHA is already offering borrowers insured loans and loans in which private lenders and FmHA participate We are now adding guaranteed farm loans made by banks and cies," Mr. Giesmann explained.

Farmers Home Administration will repay private leanding institutions up to 90 percent of any loss on a guaranteed loan, but not more than 90 percent of the orginial principal. Farmers Home also pays the bank the difference between the borrower's interest rate, and current the FmHA guaranteed rate of 90 percent for emergency and operating loans, and 8 percent for farm ownership, other local lending agen- soil and water, and recreation loans. Lenders pay FmHA a fee for each loan guaranteed,

FmHA borrowers are now through the Farmers Home paying 5 percent interest for Administration or through farm ownership, emergency, banks, Federal Land Banks, soil and water, and co-ops, insurance com-recreation loans. The inpanies, or other private terest rate for operating

Mr. Giesmann also in- limit," he said. "This means that, if 90 percent of a \$75,000 farm ownership loan is guaranteed, only \$7,500 of that loan will be charged against the lending limit."
