The all-family recreation center of the northeastern United States spotlights everything from the name entertainers, strolling costumed characters,

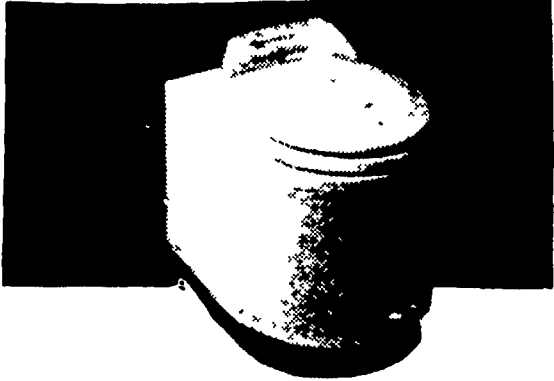
performing Dolphins, magic spectaculars, and waters that dance.
