

Civil Service Taking Applications for Jobs

The State Civil Service Commission will accept applications until further notice for two levels of community organization representatives. Starting salaries are \$13,281 and \$15,296 yearly.

A written test is not required for the positions. Candidates will be given a rating based on the education and experience reported on the civil service application and qualifications questionnaire. Those who receive a passing rating will be scheduled for an oral examination to be held at a later date.

Community organization representatives promote and direct specialized human services in the fields of public welfare and health. These services include health, aging, youth, mental health and retardation, and visual handicaps.

Applicants for community organization representative I must have a master's degree and four years of experience in social work, education, sociology, or public health. This experience must include two years of work in professional community organization and planning.

Those applying for community organization representative II must have a master's degree and six years of experience in social work, education, psychology, sociology, mental health, or related fields. This experience must include three years of administrative or supervisory work involving community

organization and planning. Equivalent combinations of experience and training may be accepted. Candidates should refer to the examination announcement for position requirements and acceptable combinations of experience and training.

Applications, examination announcements, and further information may be obtained from State Civil Service Commission offices in Harrisburg, or from local offices of the Pennsylvania State Employment Service.

U.S. Assumes Meat Records

The federal government Thursday took over the registration, record keeping and other compliance activities in Pennsylvania for the U.S. Meat and Poultry Inspection program, a spokesman said.

The action means that all meat-and-poultry related industries, even if they have been registered with the state, now must register with the Agriculture Department.

USDA took over the inspection activities in Pennsylvania for slaughtering and processing plants in mid 1972. Department officials said only that the takeover of record keeping activities, "had been under discussion with state officials for some time."

Daily state civil service examinations for construction inspector I-III and construction inspector supervisor I will be given until further notice at State Civil Service Commission offices in Harrisburg, Pittsburgh, and Philadelphia. Arrangements for daily tests must be made in advance.

Applicants for construction inspector I and II must have had one to two years of experience in construction inspection. Those applying for construction inspector III and construction inspector supervisor I must have had four to five years of progressively responsible experience in construction inspection, including one to two years in a specialty such

as hydraulic or highway and bridge construction. For construction inspector supervisor I, this experience must have included one year in a supervisory capacity.

All applicants must be high school graduates or persons with equivalent training.

Equivalent combinations of experience and training may be accepted for all positions. Applicants should refer to the examination announcement for specific details on positions requirements and acceptable combinations of experience and training.
