

John W. Scott To Deliver Grange Address

John W. Scott, national Grange master, will deliver the key address at the 51st annual leadership training school of the Pennsylvania State Grange to be held June

25, 26 and 27 at Gettysburg College.

Scott will be the speaker at the banquet which highlights the program of Wednesday, June 26. Scott's assistant, Ted E. Amick, will be the keynote speaker at the opening session of the school Tuesday afternoon, June 25.

Another national Grange official, William J. Brake, the national lecturer, will participate in the workshop

program.

Several hundred Grange leaders from all sections of the state are expected to attend the training school. They will be welcomed by Dr. Frank B. Williams, dean of students at Gettysburg College.

Miss Mildred M. Shultz, of Somerset, lecturer of the Pennsylvania State Grange, will be in charge of the sessions.

Charles Gable Honored At Ayrshire Meeting

Charles H. Gable of Conebella Farm, R.D.2, Box 118, Elverson, Pennsylvania earned his 16th Constructive Breeder Award at the 99th National Ayrshire Dairy Cattle Convention in Peoria, Illinois, April 25-27.

This award recognizes herds in which cows bred by the owner excel in milk production combined with superior body conformation and 36 breeders qualified for this honor in 1973. One a strictly twice-a-day milking schedule for 305 days, the cows made an annual production average of 13,165 lbs. milk and 538 lbs. butterfat, M. E. (Mature Equivalent). The herd has type classification score average of .856 and 97 percent of the herd was bred by the CBA winner.

During 1973, Gable received special certificate for one of his older cows for her lifetime milk production of 100,000 pounds during the

year. She was Conebella Tora Pauls with 107,384 lbs. of 4.3 percent milk and 4706 lbs. fat.

In reaching these production levels, the cows were never milked more than twice-a-day and records were checked by the Pennsylvania State University's Department of Official Testing, University Park, Pennsylvania.

DHIR Cites Kreider Herd

Milk and butterfat production levels established by Registered Holstein cows in this area have been reported by Holstein-Friesian Association of America. All cows are from the herd of John E. Kreider 523 Willow Rd., Lancaster and are enrolled in the Dairy Herd Improvement Registry (DHIR) official testing program.

Trout-Spring X Dina Lorraine, 5-4, 18,100 pounds milk, 594 pounds fat, 3.3 percent test in 317 days milked.

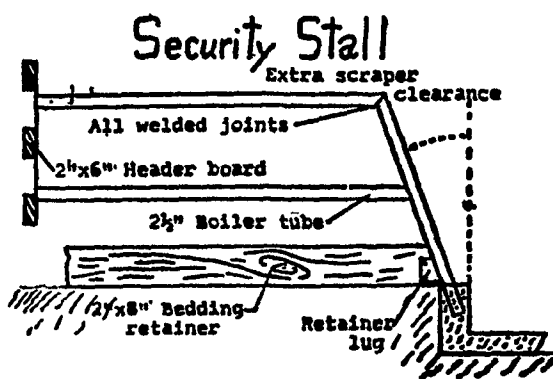

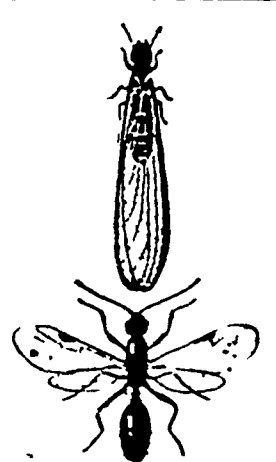

Close Zippers Before Laundering

Be sure to close garment zippers before laundering and when placing clothes on hangers. This will help insure the garments keep their shape and will help make them last longer, explains Mrs. Ruth Ann Wilson, Extension clothing specialist at The Pennsylvania State University. To prevent jamming, Mrs. Wilson recommends applying wax or zipper lubricant to the nylon coils or metal teeth at the first sign of zippers sticking.




Which Bug is the Termite?
