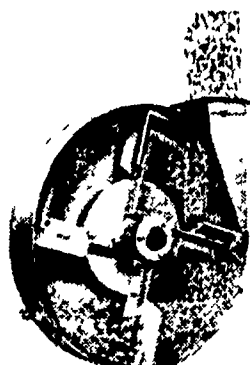

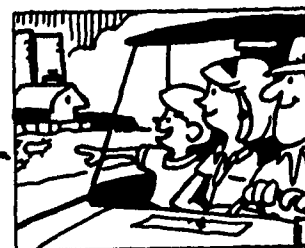

**HOW TO MAKE THE FAMILY VACATION
AN ENJOYABLE FORM OF EDUCATION**

Many parents mistakenly consider a trip abroad "wasted" on children. This is far from the truth. A way-

far family can find there's a fund of fun and information for them to discover when they travel together. For one thing, nothing establishes rapport with people as quickly as being with your children. As one airline executive says: "Customs officials unbend, airline hostesses take special interest, museum guards look up and smile. The total effect is one of warmth and welcome wherever you go. Any trip with children is punctuated by adventure, less overeating, regular hours and more time spent in educational pursuits."

Wise parents who want to fan wanderlust, curiosity and interest while their children are young would do well to plan trips that have some bearing on what their offspring are studying in school. It might be state or regional history, Europe, Mexico, the Far East, the paintings and sculpture they've only seen in photographs, the countries on their geography class maps, the laboratories of famous scientists, the metric system in operation. Travel games such as "Geography" not only keep children busy on long rides, they're educational and heighten a youngster's



awareness of the passing scene.

You needn't worry about accommodations in countries your kids are not accustomed to. You can stay at a Holiday Inn in over 40 countries around the world. They have English speaking inn-keepers, American standards of comfort and cleanliness, swimming pools, televisions, telephones, doctors and dentists on call, baby sitters, free advance reservations, baby beds, valet and laundry service, free ice, and if your children are under 12, they can stay in your room for free. In addition, Holiday Inns serve American as well as continental and native foods.

Before you go, teach your children how to say "please," "thank you," the numbers from one to ten and a few basic expressions in the languages of the countries you'll be visiting. See how much confidence it will give them in communicating with other people, and how much fun they'll have. Young people tend to learn languages faster and more easily than adults, anyway. In one family of tireless travellers, the children can ask for ice cream in five different languages!

The time to begin teaching your children to be citizens of the world is now. It can stimulate their imagination, help make them worldly-wise, accustom them to unfamiliar situations and enrich your family life and personal experience. It would seem that traveling without your family would be a waste!

Helpful Tip

When you prepare fresh fruits for salads or desserts ahead of time; either cover them with water or sprinkle them with lemon juice to prevent discoloration. This method will save you last minute preparation time and help keep the fruit fresh and colorful.
