
Use Caution with Cosmetics

Cosmetics are used on the skin and hair. These are sensitive areas which can be easily infected if mistreated, reminds Mrs. Ruth Ann Wilson, Extension clothing specialist at The Pennsylvania State University. She urges you to note warnings on cosmetic labels and follow instructions carefully. If you believe you've been misled or injured by a cosmetic, report the facts to the nearest Food and Drug Administration office or to your local or state regulatory agency. Seek medical help if you need it. You should also save the rest of the product or container and report what happened to the packer or distributor. If you have a skin infectionsee your doctor. Don't rely on a cosmetic to cover it up.

Shearing and Pruning Not the Same

Although the terms are often used interchangeably, there is a difference between shearing and pruning, remind Extension ornamental horticulturists at The Pennsylvania State University.

Shearing is that form of pruning in which all young shoots extending beyond a definite line are cut off. On the other hand, pruning properly involves cutting individual shoots or branches to improve the tree or shrub as your main goal.
