

# Sew Your Own Sports Equipment

The home sewing boom now includes making some of your own sports equipment. How about making you own tent, sleeping bag, duffel bag, or camping outerwear? Kits are available for thermo vests, weather-all ponchos and rainpants, and all types of equipment for the hardy outdoor enthusiast.

Mrs. Ruth Ann Wilson, Extension clothing specialist at The Pennsylvania State University, points out that a Minnesota company developed the kits and is

conducting training classes. With modern textile developments, it is possible to obtain new, lightweight outer fabrics, light-weight insulation of man-made fibers, sturdy zippers and buckles. These are easy to work with, and the company has developed kits for garments and accessories suitable for home sewing machines.

Mrs. Wilson says you can save about half the cost by making your own outdoor wear since labor usually accounts for at least half the
