SUMMARY FOR MAY, 1974

There were approximately 910 dairy replacement cattle reported on of which an estimated 850 head were native (Pennsylvania) and 60 head were imported. This compared with a total of 500 head for April, 1974.

Compared with the April, 1974 report, the market was moderate to active, mostly active. Cows were mostly \$50 to \$150 lower. Heifers were mostly steady to mostly \$50 lower.
