

WHAT'S A FOOT

THE DO-IT-YOURSELF DOLL HOUSE!

It's easier than you may think to create this delightful doll house for the young lady in your life. All it takes is some time and tile, and a minimum of toil!

You'll need two pieces of quarter inch plywood, one 1 by 8 feet and the other 27 by 81 inches, 31 pieces of Kentile Colonial Red Brick Vinyl tile, 25 pieces of Colonial White, six tacks, 13 small brass hinges with removable pins, and a 36 by 18 inch posterboard.

Cut the smaller piece of wood into three 27 inch squares. Cut the larger into

two sections, each 27 inches wide and forming a peak 15 inches high. Cut two 12 inch square chimney pieces above the peak for the proper angle, and two roof pieces 21 by 30 inches. Cut out a 21 by 25 inch opening in the back and saw it into two 12 inch square chimney sides.

Hinge together the front, back and sides, the two roof halves, and the chimney sides. Tack thin strips of wood across the inside of the front and sides for the 27 inch square second floor.

For the sides of the house, put three tiles across



and three tiles high, leaving the middle one out. In front,

you need three tiles across and five high, but omit the bottom two and the next-to-the-top in the center row for the window and door. Warm white tiles in a low oven and cut them to form the roof and the back. Put three across and two high on the upper back. Glue them all on with Kenfast Adhesive No. 2.

Cut the nine by 18 inch door from stiff posterboard, paint on decorations and use plastic wrap for the glass. Cut out the door piece, hinge it to the front of the house and glue on the posterboard.

Cut out three 18 by 9 inch posterboard pieces for the windows, score the board four and a half inches from each end and bend for shutters. Cut window pane out of center section and line with plastic wrap. Glue on shutters.

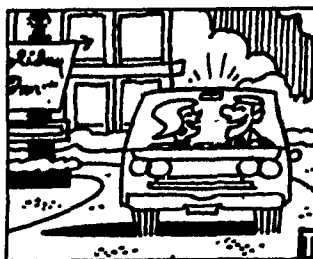
