In Lancaster, the average temperature for the week was 69 degrees. Growing degree days for crops that start at 40 degrees totaled 1340, 137 more than the normal average.

For crops starting at 50 degrees, growing degree days totaled 686, which is 113 more than the average.

Rainfall for the week was inches. Rainfall measured from April 1, was 9.30 inches, .58 inches more than the normal average.
