CRANBERRY ICE CREAM SALADS

1 can (1 lb.) whole cran-

- berry sauce 2 teaspoons orange peel
- 2 large oranges 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 1 package (3 oz.) orange flavor gelatin

1 pint vanilla ice cream Salad greens Break apart cranberry sauce

and drain; reserve liquid. Peel orange and dice sections, reserving juice. Combine cranberry liquid, orange and lemon juices and enough water to give 1 cup. Heat liquid to boiling and pour over gelatin until dissolved. Add

in consistency (this will take only a short time due to the rapid cooling of, ice cream). Fold in orange peel, diced oranges, and cranberry sauce; turn into 8 individual salad molds, 5-oz. each. Chill until firm. Serve on salad greens and garnish with additional orange sections, if desired. This is a refreshing salad to accompany broiled chicken, roast turkey or other fowl.
