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Growing Degree Days

A report from Penn State of weekly crop and weather round-ups with a report on weather conditions for the week ending June 10.

In Lancaster, the average temperature for the week was 71 degrees, 1 degree less than normal. Growing degree days for crops that start at 40 degrees totaled 1753, 133 more than the average.

For crops starting at 50 degrees, degree days totaled 959 which is 109 more than the average.

Rainfall for the week was 1.42 inches. Rainfall measured from April 1, was 11.78 inches 1.22 inches more than the normal average.

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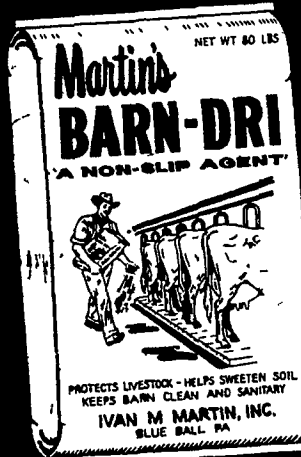


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
