Bull Testing Program Schedules

Secretary of Agriculture Jim McHale today said nominations are now being received for the second bull testing program at the Meat Animal Evaluation Center (MAEC), University Park, Pa.

MAEC is funded through a portion of the Commonwealth's share of pari-mutuel wagering at licensed harness racing tracks. The Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture administers funding for more than a score of research projects dealing with agricultural production, plant and animal health and rural development.

The first year of performance-testing of beef bulls culminated early this spring with the sale of 53 herd sires. "This was the first sale of this kind ever to be held in Pennsylvania," Secretary McHale noted, "and judging from the response our beef producers are really looking for proven herd sires." The sale averaged \$1,223.40 per head. About 70 young bulls can be accommodated at the

MAEC and those qualifying for admittance will be accepted on a first come, first served basis. To be eligible bulls must be born between October 1, 1973 and April 15, 1974. Deadline for accepting nominations is August 14, 1974.

Performance testing evaluates beef bulls for rate of gain, structural soundness, muscularity and estimated carcass merit. The top three-fourths of this year's class will be sold at auction in March, 1975 with the proceeds going to the breeders. Those animals not consigned to the sale will be returned to their original owners.

Livestock breeders who have their bulls calves accepted for the program will pay for feed and routine

veterinary costs on a pro rata basis for the entire 140-day stay in the MAEC pens.


