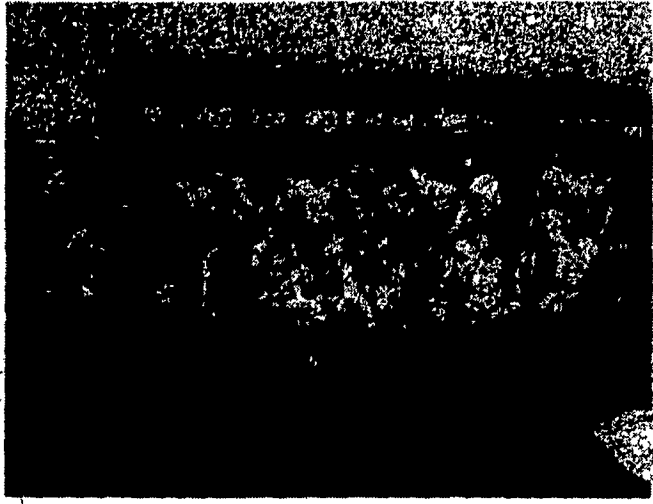
Broken Bit 4-H Club
