## Physical Fitness Team

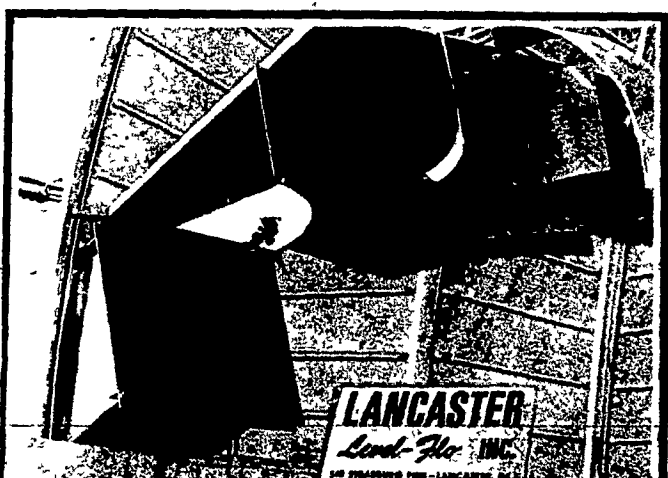

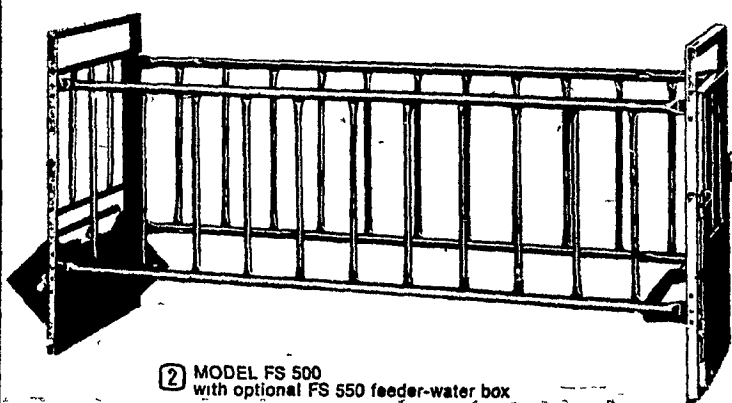
