The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) said today it will increase its fees for inspection and grading of manufactured or processed dairy products on July 3. The

increases are needed to bring charges in line with increased operating costs, according to officials in USDA's Agricultural
Marketing Service (AMS).
Fees will be increased for

both day and night inspection and grading services, as well as for individual laboratory tests. The charge for inspection

and grading services performed between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. (day services) will be increased from \$13.20 per hour to \$16.00 per hour and for services between 6 p.m. and 6 a.m. (night services) from \$14.25 per hour to \$17.50 per hour. The hourly charge for labortary services will be increased from \$14.30 to

\$18.00. The hourly rates for continuous non-resident inspection services are being increased from \$15.60 to \$18.60 for day services and from \$16.92 to \$20.20 for night services. Continous nonresident inspection service deals mainly with the processing or repacking of donated food for domestic distribution to schools, needy persons, and charitable institutions. The hourly charge for holiday, Saturday, Sunday, and overtime work is being increased from \$22,20 to \$26,60.

The method of charging for continuous resident inspection will also be changed on July 3. Currently, charges are based on the inspector's Young Cooperator for Inter-State Milk Producers' Cooperative; Mr. & Mrs. John Porter Burns, Jr., Charles Town, W. Va., Maryland & Virginia Milk Producers Association. These Young Cooperators will attend the National Milk Producers Federation annual meeting in Ball Harbor, Florida, this fall.

Inter-State's second place winners Mr. and Mrs. Robert E. Smith, York Springs, Pa., will also attend the NMPF

salary plus 50 percent for administrative costs. After July 3, however, users of the service will be charged \$12.00 per hour for the inspector in charge and \$10.00 per hour for each assistant inspector.

The Agricultural Marketing Act of 1946 provides for AMS to collect fees approximately equal to the cost of rendering the service. The July 3 increases, which have been discussed with the dairy industry, will bring revenue more nearly in balance with cost, AMS officials said. Grading and inspection of dairy products is a voluntary service, provided on request.

The new rates are scheduled for publication in the Federal Register July 3 as an amendment to dairy products inspection regulations.




