Pollution Control Gets Special Tax Treatment

Pollution control facilities and equipment for farm and business machinery may qualify for rapid federal tax depreciation if installed and certified before Jan. 1, 1975, says James T. Hall, economist, Extension Service, U. S. Department of Agriculture.

Farmers and businessmen may depreciate (amortize) the cost of certain pollution control facilities and equipment over a period of five years (60 months).

Mr. Hall points out that such facilities must have been installed and appropriately certified by state and federal pollution control certifying authorities after 1968 and prior to 1975. Also, the Internal Revenue code provides that the facility must be "a new identifiable treatment facility used in

connection with a plant (or other property) that was in operation before 1969."

Any facility that is used to control the pollution or contamination of air or water is eligible, if the other conditions are met.

For additional details and information, Mr. Hall suggests obtaining a free copy of Internal Revenue Service Publication No. 577, "Amortization of Pollution Control Facilities" at any Internal Revenue Service office.
