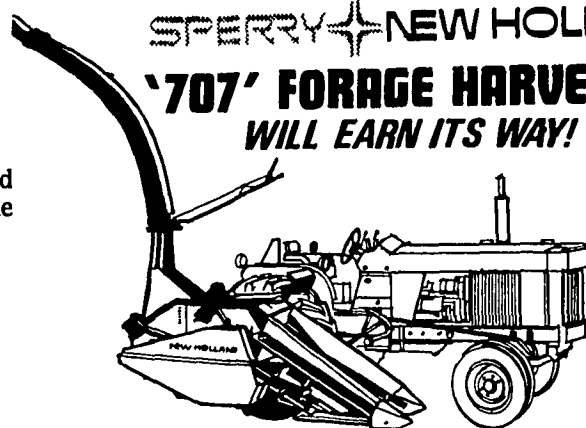
Willow Maple Bonus Lea has produced 17,040 pounds of milk in 305 days with a 4.1 percent test and 706 pounds of fat.

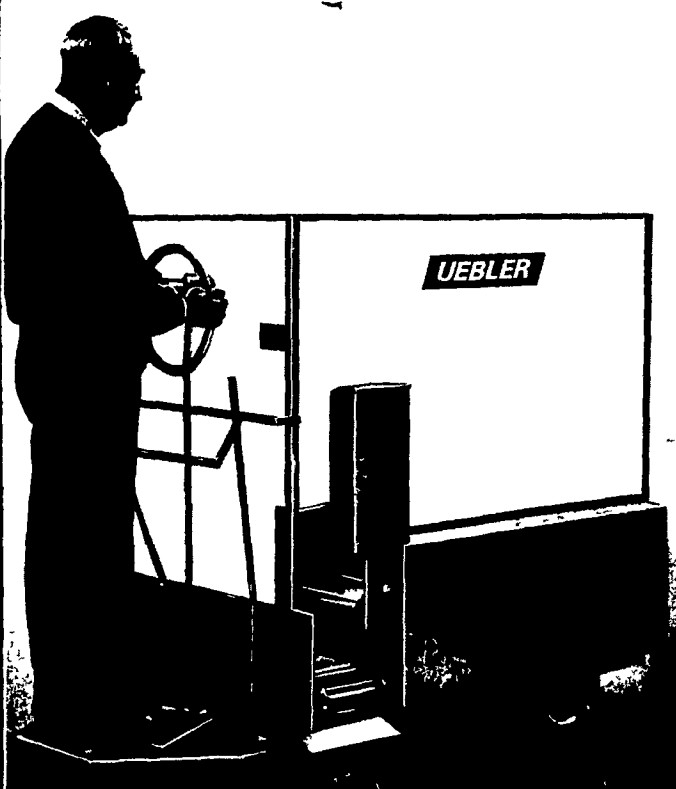
