### Ova Transfer Information Available

"Ova Transfer" is a flyer available from the Genetics Division of Carnation Company, according to Dr. Harold J. Schmidt, division manager.

Dr. Schmidt said, "Through techniques of super ovulation and surgical transfer of fertilized embryos, annual calf crops can be increased. The infant industry of commercial ova transfer companies is averaging nearly two calves per surgery. We at Carnation-Genetics feel this record is not economical . . . our goal is at least four pregnancies, and perhaps 6 or 8 pregnancies per surgery.

"The research facilities and staff of specialists at Carnation-Genetics are working for the economical application of super ovulation, sex separation, ova transfer and a host of other projects."

The ova transfer project is

being conducted by Dr. Krish Karihaloo, who earned his B.V. Science from Rajasthan University; Post Graduate diploma from the University of N.S.W. Sydney, Australia; M. of Science from the University N.S.W. Sydney, Australia; and his Ph.D. from the University of Alberta, Edmonton, Canada.


