Low Yield, Disaster Payments Available

Lebanon county farmers are urged to enroll in feed grain & Wheat program now if they have not done so. The dry weather the last few weeks can have a drastic affect on corn yields since it is in the pollinating stage.

Low yield and crop disaster payments are available through the program on Wheat & Feed Grains (corn, barley & Grain Sorghum). Target price payments are also available if market prices should fall drastically. Commodity loans may be obtained on farm stored or warehouse stored grain.

Farmers are not required to have any idle ground or conserving base (hay ground) for participation in the 1974 programs. Contact the local Lebanon ASCS office now for details.

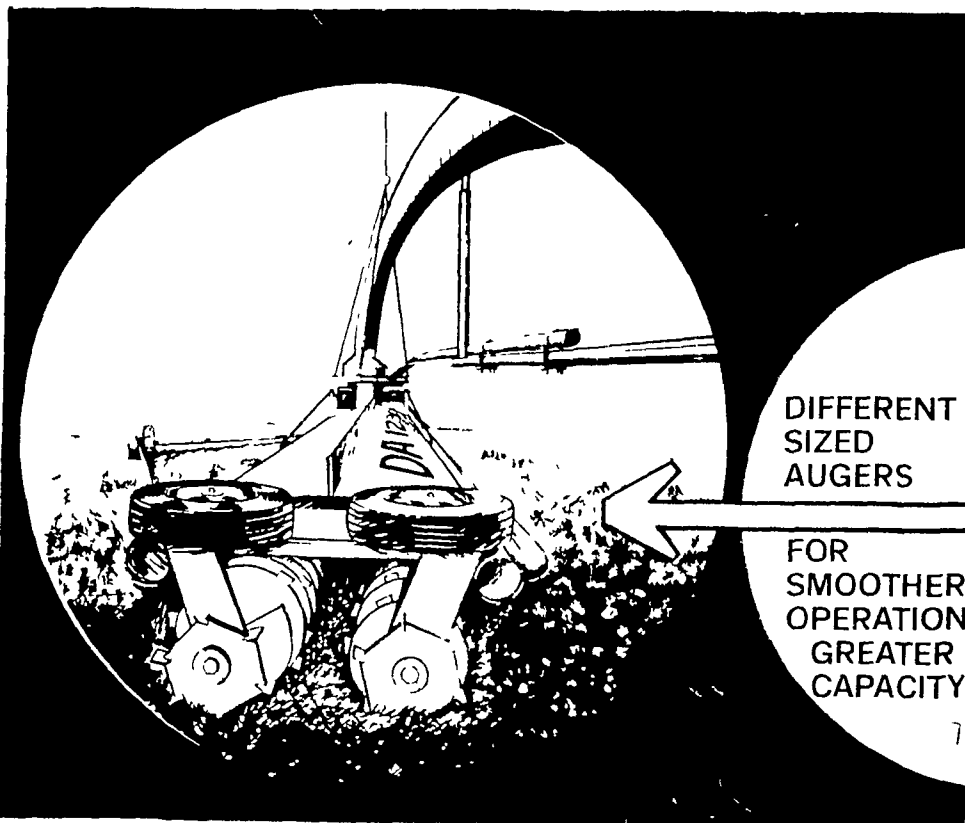
