Eggplant Aromatic

Slice 1 medium eggplant and sprinkle with salt and pepper. Saute in hot butter or salad oil until lightly browned on both sides. Peel and slice 2 medium-sized onions. Slice 1/2 pound of cheese. Place alternate slices of eggplant, sliced onion and sliced cheese in casserole. Add 2 teaspoons aromatic bitters to two 8-oz. cans tomato sauce, and additional salt, if needed. Pour over ingredients in casserole and bake in a moderate oven (375°F) for 20 minutes. Yields six servings.
