#### Millipedes

Numerous phone calls to our Extension Office reflect the common problem of millipedes in many areas. These small, worm-like, hard-shelled, copper-colored insects have been a problem for many years. To our knowledge they do not do any damage but are a definite nuisance around and in the home. They are often found near new buildings, or where there are large amounts of peat moss or other organic

matter. The control is merely to keep spraying or sprinkling with Sevin, Malathion, or Diazinon around walks, porches, and in the shrub area near these entrances. Repeated sprays are needed every few days in order to keep them out of the house. The Japanese Beetles are now making their annual appearance and these same sprays will be needed frequently in order to protect plants.
