

Maine 4-Hers To Visit County

Lancaster County 4-H members and families will open their homes to thirty 4-H members from Oxford County, Maine from July 29th until August 4th. The first part of a 4-H Interstate Exchange Program begins with the arrival of the Maine 4-Hers at the Farm and Home Center at noon on Monday.

Lancaster County hosts will meet at 11:30 A.M. to finalize plans for the week. On Tuesday, July 30th, Maine and Lancaster 4-Hers will leave at 1:00 P.M. from the Farm and Home Center to tour Landis Valley Farm Museum and parts of the county including a stop at a local dairy bar. Wednesday's activities

include a family picnic and swim party. The final event planned for Maine 4-Hers is the Rutherford County, Tennessee 4-H Square Dancers performance on Saturday, August 3rd at 8:00 P.M. in the Farm and Home Center Auditorium. Lancaster County 4-Hers will travel to Oxford County, Maine, August 17th to the 25th to make a return visit with their guests in Lancaster this week.

The Interstate Exchange Program sponsored by Lancaster County 4-H Council is coordinated by the Cooperative Extension Service as part of its 4-H Youth Program. 4-H members from ages 13-19 are eligible to participate. Lancaster County has been active in the program for several years. Recent Exchange trips have been conducted with Michigan, Iowa, Tennessee, North Carolina and Kentucky. About 100 Lancaster County 4-H seamstresses will participate in 4-H Dress Revue on Thursday, August 1st at the Farm and Home Center, Lancaster.

Dress Revue competition begins at 9:00 A.M. with participant judging. All models judge each other on clothing construction, appearance and modeling abilities. Top scorers will then be judged by two professional judges, Mrs. Jean Pryzbylowski and Mrs. Barbara Shenk.

A special feature of this year's Dress Revue is Mrs. Ruth Adams, Fashion Consultant for John Wannamaker's, Harrisburg, who will present a program on fashion and fashion accessories at 11:00 A.M. A buffet luncheon for all participants and guests follows. The climax of the day's activities is the 4-H Dress Revue Fashion Show. This year's theme is the "Many Eras of Fashion". Along with the new outfits made by 4-H members, a few old costumes will be modeled.

Six Senior Dress Revue contestants and three Junior Dress Revue contestants will be selected to attend Regional Dress Revue to be held in Harrisburg on August 9th.

Millipedes Numerous phone calls to our Extension Office reflect the common problem of millipedes in many areas. These small, worm-like, hard-shelled, copper-colored insects have been a problem for many years. To our knowledge they do not do any damage but are a definite nuisance around and in the home. They are often found near new buildings, or where there are large amounts of peat moss or other organic

matter. The control is merely to keep spraying or sprinkling with Sevin, Malathion, or Diazinon around walks, porches, and in the shrub area near these entrances. Repeated sprays are needed every few days in order to keep them out of the house. The Japanese Beetles are now making their annual appearance and these same sprays will be needed frequently in order to protect plants.

Sperry New Holland Motion Picture Cited

An agricultural motion picture produced by Sperry New Holland has won a top award from the Committee for International Non-Theatrical Events (CINE).

The CINE Gold Eagle award will be presented to Sperry New Holland for the "Agri-Newsreel-1973," a motion picture showing new

and unusual agricultural developments throughout North America. Competition for the award was open to film producers around the world.

"Agri-Newsreel-1973" was written and directed by Donald L. Collins, press relations supervisor for Sperry New Holland. Aldin Brown, senior photographer for the company, was cameraman.

Collins and Brown traveled to Mexico's developing dairy districts in the mountainous Laguna area for one segment. To get story of a husband and wife farming an island in Lake Ontario, the team flew into the island on a ski-equipped light plane during the winter when coyotes were threatening the couple's sheep.

Other stories included modern cowboys at work in British Columbia; a modern hay pelleting plant in Ohio; and an Alberta community fighting for survival after years of devastating rains and a visit with President Nixon by the Farm Family of the Year.

The award will be presented at a ceremony in Washington, D.C. later this year.
