High-good to prime 1050-1350 pound steers 1.00-1.50 higher, others 50-1.00 higher. Choice and prime 900-1050 pound heifers mostly 1.00 higher, increased supply others unevenly strong to 1.00 higher. Cows 2.00-3.00 lower. Bulls fully steady.

Four day receipts 18,800 as compared 18,900 previous week and 9,100 a year ago under unsettled conditions.

Slaughter steers approximately 50 percent, heifers 29 percent, cows 17 percent. Prices on fed cattle trade continued upward although buyers increasingly selective for grade and weight. Best demand for choice and prime 1050-1300 pound steers and same grade 950-1050 pound heifers.
