

Wentink Defends Egg Advertising

In a statement responding to the Federal Trade Commission's seeking a cease-and-desist order in United States District Court at Chicago, Hendrik Wentink, chairman of the National Commission on Egg Nutrition, said that the American people have a right to know all the facts. "NCEN advertising has created a controversy and the controversy is in the public interest.

"The full cholesterol story must be put before the American public—not just one side of an issue which has created so much dissension in the ranks of the scientific community. That these ads have in themselves sparked further dialogue between researchers makes them worthy of attention. Additionally, they contained vital information on cholesterol which the public has a right to know.

"NCEN is exercising a fundamental right as a not-for-profit group. We have been providing documented, scientific information, not advertising a proprietary product to the American people. We did not make up statements in our ads and

then liberally sprinkle our copy with quotation marks," Mr. Wentink stated. "When we quote from articles in the Journal of the American Medical Association, or from

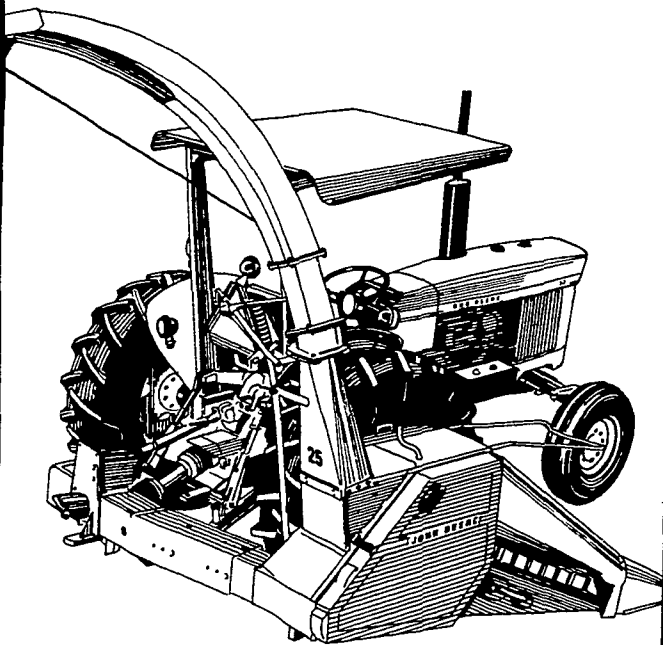

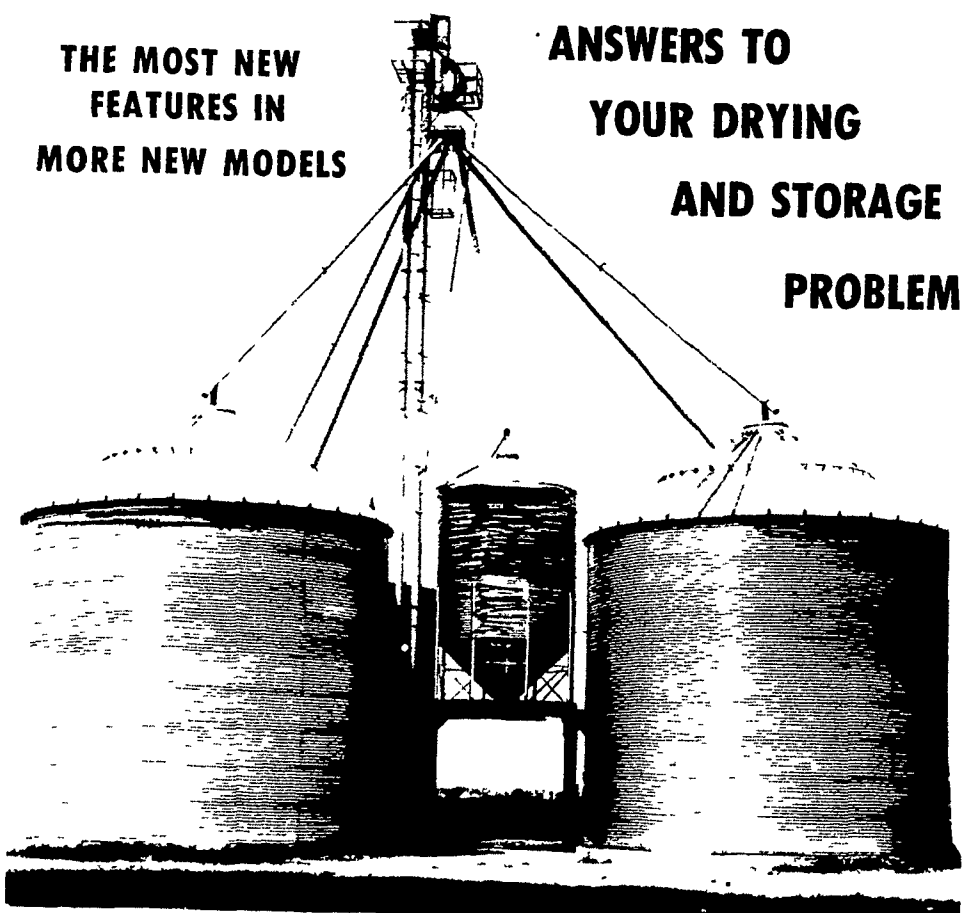
