Lueck Receives Chadwick Award

Dennis C. Lueck, of 517 Pleasure Road, Lancaster, a June graduate of The Pennsylvania State University, has been named recipient of the 1974 L. C. Chadwick Outstanding Senior Student Award in Ornamental and Landscape Horticulture which is presented by the American Society for Horticultural Science.

The award, \$200 and a plaque, given to the outstanding college senior in the United States majoring in ornamental and landscape horticulture, was presented today at the Society's 71st annual meeting held in conjunction with the Canadian Society for Horticultural Science at the University of Guelph, Ontario, Canada.

The award is named in honor of Dr. L. C. Chadwick, emeritus professor of floriculture and ornamental horticulture at Ohio State University. Criteria used in the selection includes scholastic ability, contributions to the student's department, and extracurricular activities.

Lueck, who completed 170 credits during 12 terms at Penn State, 39 more than

required, was the top student scholastically in the College of Agriculture receiving a baccalaureate degree in 1974.

Student activities included president and vice president of the Penn State Horticulture Club and a member of the Agriculture Student Council, Hort Club Show, and Department of Horticulture Curriculum Committee and Arboretum Committee.

Lueck also was a member of the Penn State Biology Club, Eco-Action Club, Outing Club, and State College Bird Club. He currently belongs to the Lancaster Audubon Society and Muhlenberg Botanical Society.

His work-study activities include employment at the Longwood Summer Laboratory in Ornamental Horticulture; field representative for Gerber Products, Inc.; a member of a student project involving the design and planting of a selected part of the Penn State campus; and student horticultural director of a project on the identification and location of woody plants on the campus for future inclusion in the Penn State arboretum.

Lueck's national honorary societies are Alpha Zeta,

Gamma Sigma Delta, Phi Kappa Phi, Phi Eta Sigma, and Pi Alpha Xi.

Honors include the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency Scholarship; Town 'N' Country Garden Club Scholarship of Lancaster; Joseph M. Johnston Award; and Harry W. Skinner Scholarship.

Lueck is currently on a

two-year assignment in Europe working and studying various aspects of ornamental and landscape horticulture. He is presently in Sweden. In October he will go to France where he will spend a year then to Switzerland to study during 1976. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Arnold C. Lueck, associate Lancaster County agricultural agent.
