Beef cut out off by fully 1/4 cent due to lower prices on beef rough cuts. Demand for beef chucks less urgent than early while rounds continue under pressure. Lamb hind saddles and legs very slow and pork mostly slow except butts.

MORE FEEDER PIG SALES SCHEDULED.

Beginning in September, and every month thereafter, bimonthly Feeder Pig Sales will be held as a result of increasing receipts and popular demand on the part of both buyers and sellers.

Feeder pigs consigned to Walter M. Dunlap and Sons must arrive at the stockyards between 7 A. M. and 11 A. M. the day of the sale. Upon arrival they will be inspected by a veterinarian, tagged, and then state graded.

The two sales scheduled for September will be held on Tuesday, the 3rd, and Tuesday, the 17th, starting at 1 P. M. Consignors wishing to tag their pigs on the farm can get the tags at the state office at the stockyards, not later than 4 P. M. any day preceding the sale, thereby saving 25 cents per pig
