

Rural Leadership School Scheduled

A six-day session of the National Rural Development Leaders School has been scheduled for participants from 13 northeast states, the

U. S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced today.

This fourth session of the school, to be held Nov. 17-23,

1974, near Scranton, Pa., is open to rural community leaders from Connecticut, Delaware, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Vermont, Virginia, and West Virginia. The class is limited to 110 persons who desire technical background and formal training in the process of rural development. Participants will be selected to represent a broad segment of rural development leadership.

Inviting applications to attend the school, Dr. Walter A. Guntharp, administrator of USDA's Rural Development Service, said rural leaders are faced with a greater challenge today than ever before. Representing a third of the nation's people living on 90 percent of the land, rural leaders have unprecedented need for knowledge and expertise in the development process in these changing times, he added.

The school is designed to help state and local leaders

learn how to identify and rank their area's problems and development potential, and to marshal resources to implement priority programs and projects. Participants will be selected from among:

- Elected and appointed state and local officials with positions of responsibility relating to some phase of rural development.
- Voluntary leaders in state and local public service organizations concerned with community or area development.
- Business, industrial, and civic leaders interested in rural development.

Applications must be received no later than October 17. Individuals will be notified of selection by October 25. Persons who wish to apply are invited to contact their State Rural Development Committee through a local USDA office, write the Rural Development Service, U. S. 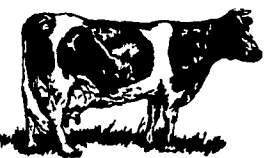

Ox Roast Set For Sept. 21

A deep-pit ox roast—the only one presented regularly in Lancaster County—will be held at the Salunga Fire Company pavilion Saturday, Sept. 21, from 1 to 7 p.m.

The sponsoring Landisville Lions Club announces that the Hearing Conservation Center of Lancaster County will benefit from the proceeds. Free hearing tests will be given at the ox roast.

In order to obtain the large quantity of fuel required for the ox roast fire, the Lions will perform a public service by removing and cutting up logs which piled up more

than two years ago during Tropical Storm Agnes, at Chiques Mill Dam near Salunga, in Big Chiques Creek. A bed of hot coals four feet deep is required to roast the beef.

Take-out and eat-in meals will be provided. The beef is served in slices on large rolls, with baked potatoes, roasting ears, applesauce and beverage. Extra ears of corn will be available without charge.
