- 12 cup shortening 2 cups granulated sugar
- 2 beaten egg yolks (reserve whites till last)
- 21/2 cups cake flour
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 11/2 teaspoons soda
- 1 cup sour milk
- 1 cup boiling water
- 2 squares baking chocolate
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

Cream sugar and shortening. Add beaten egg yolks. Sift flour, then measure. Sift flour, baking powder and salt. Add milk and flour alternately. Melt chocolate in double boiler. Add boiling water, then soda. Beat and pour in hot. Mix batter. Add vanilla. Beat egg whites till stiff and fold into batter. Bake at 350 degrees.


