

#### Milk Production **Up 4 Percent**

Milk production in Pennsylvania during August was averaged 850 pounds in 566 million pounds, 4 per- August, compared with 875 cent more than a year ago, pounds in July and 825 according to the Crop Reporting Service.

The number of milk cows in the Commonwealth during August was 666,000 - 2,000 more than last month, and 4,000 more than a year ago.

Milk production per cow pounds in August last year. United States milk

production during August is estimated at 9,580 million pounds, 1 percent above a year earlier, but 4 percent below August 1972. U.S. average milk production per cow was 860 pounds during August, up 3 percent from the 834 pounds of August 1973, and 1 percent above the 855 pounds recorded 2 years earlier. There were 11.1 million milk cows on farms during August, down 2 percent from a year ago and 4,000 head below July.
