Donald V. Seipt, Easton RD4, was elected president of the Dairy Shrine to succeed outgoing president Dr. George Trimberger, Cornell University.





Acker, Chester County's dairy princess who was state runner up, and Mary Ellen Krompasky, Wayne County, who was named Miss Congeniality.




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
