

Apply for Antlerless License Sept. 30th

Antlerless deer license from Pennsylvania resident applications will be accepted hunters beginning on Sep-

tember 30, under rules and regulations adopted by the Game Commission.

Under the Game Law, county treasurers are designated as the issuing agents for antlerless licenses. The Game Law provides that antlerless deer licenses "shall be issued without restriction or regard to the county residence of the Pennsylvania applicant."

There are two important changes in the 1974 rules governing applications for antlerless licenses. First, all antlerless license applications must be submitted to county treasurers by mail only. Applications will not be accepted over the counter.

Second, a hunter may not apply for more than one antlerless license this year.

The Game Commission's rules and regulations on the issuance of antlerless deer licenses follow:

1. Only the original antlerless deer license application form issued as a part of the hunter's license shall be valid for making application for an antlerless deer license.

2. The antlerless license application form issued with the hunting license shall not be transferable or used by any other person.

3. County treasurers shall accept applications for antlerless licenses by mail only starting with the opening of treasurers' offices for business on September 30.

4. Applications submitted by mail shall be in accordance with the following regulations:

a. Limited to one ap-

plication per envelope.

b. Name and legal home address of the applicant shall be placed on the outside top left corner of the front of the envelope.

c. The words "Antlerless Deer License Application" shall be affixed on the outside lower left hand corner of the front of the envelope.

d. Remittance shall be only in the form of check or money order in the amount of \$3.35, made payable to "County Treasurer." The remittance includes return postage.

e. Person applying for a license must complete (type or print for mailing) all three sections of the application.

5. County treasurers shall issue antlerless licenses by mail only no earlier than the opening of their respective offices for business on October 7. All licenses shall be mailed to successful applicants no later than November 15.

If the county quota of antlerless licenses has not been exhausted by November 15, applications may continue to be received and licenses issued until the supply is depleted.

6. A county treasurer electing to conduct an impartial, random, public drawing observed by sportsmen and other interested persons to select applications for the issuance of antlerless licenses may do so if the first five steps listed previously are followed and if the county treasurer announces the date, time and place of the drawing to all available news media in the area at least one week in advance of the drawing. Such drawing shall be conducted between October 5 and October 9, both dates inclusive.

Thus far, the following county treasurers have notified the Game Com-

mission that they will hold drawings for antlerless licenses on these dates listed: Jefferson, Schuylkill and Westmoreland, October 5; Berks, Bucks, Clearfield and Franklin, October 7; Dauphin and Lehigh, October 8; and Lebanon, October 9.

7. County treasurers shall return all unsuccessful applications at the earliest possible date, but in any event no later than October 15, in order that the applicant may re-apply to another county which may have licenses available.

8. Any unsuccessful applicant whose application has been returned may, by changing the county designation in which he wishes to hunt, re-apply in another county which has unsold licenses available.

Under provisions of the Game Law, applications for antlerless deer licenses received from nonresidents of Pennsylvania and non-resident aliens may not be approved or licenses issued prior to November 16 this year. Alien residents of Pennsylvania will be considered regular residents

when applying for antlerless licenses in 1974.

The Game Commission is aware of the possibility that some sportsmen who may wish to hunt as a group may not all obtain antlerless licenses for a particular county. But since the antlerless season is essentially a deer management tool, not all hunters' wishes can be accommodated during an antlerless season as is done in buck season.

A father who is an unsuccessful applicant may accompany his son if the father does not carry a firearm or bow and arrow or drive deer, and the same is true if the son is the unsuccessful applicant.

This year, there will be 389,650 antlerless deer licenses available in Pennsylvania, compared to 352,100 authorized last year.

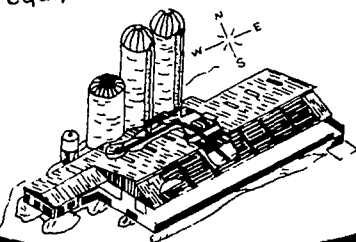

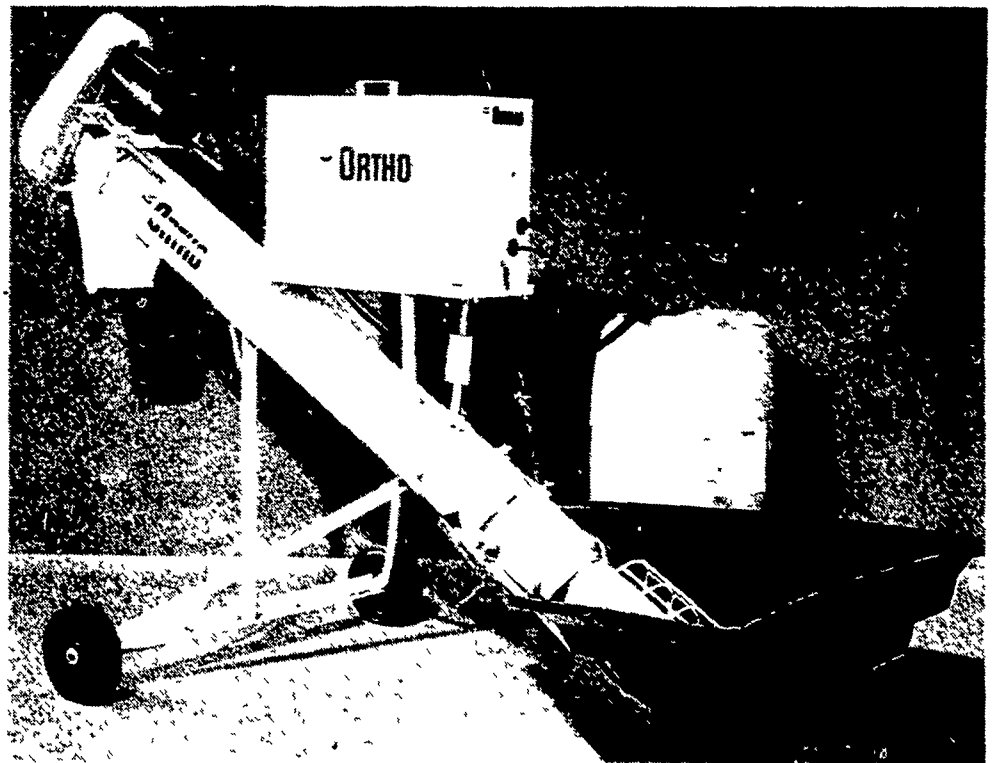
