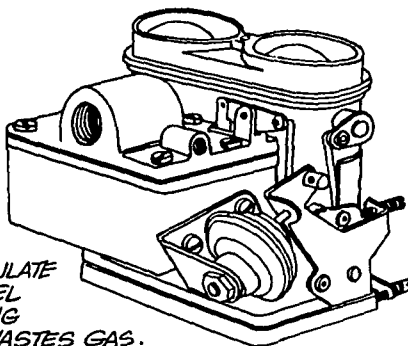

4. After your transaction has been completed, the teller will send the carrier back—for you to remove the material and go happily on your way.

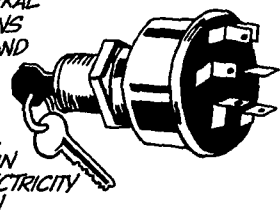

Automobile Service Tips

IGNITION SWITCH— REALLY SEVERAL SWITCHES IN ONE. FIRST, IT TURNS ON IGNITION, THEN THE STARTER—AND SIMULTANEOUSLY TURNS OFF THE RADIO AND OTHER ACCESSORIES TO AVOID DAMAGE DUE TO POWER SURGES WHICH OCCUR IN STARTING. AS IT AGES, RESISTANCE BUILDS IN THE SWITCH SO NOT ENOUGH ELECTRICITY GETS TO STARTER AND IGNITION.
