Bulk of the feeders for Friday auction. The decline in fed cattle prices of recent weeks continued on Monday as steer and heifer prices were pushed sharply lower. However, the downturn was erased in later trading supported by very moderate supplies and sharply advancing prices in the wholesale carcass trade. Midweek demand good on slaughter steers and heifers were higher for the first time




