

# Chester 4-H Goat Show

Two of the top three honors at the Chester County 4-H Goat Show were captured by Richard Stoneback, Oxford. Stoneback exhibited the grand champion animal while being judged grand champion showman. He is the son of Dr. and Mrs. Richard Stoneback.

Sarah Weinstock, Phoenixville, won the other top honor by being named grand champion fitter for the show. She also exhibited the reserve grand champion animal. Her brothers Michael and Joshua were named champion junior and first year fitter respectively. Michael also exhibited the junior champion goat while his sister Rachel, exhibited the reserve junior champion goat.

Other results of the show included: Junior Kid Class (Goats 6 months of age and younger) blue ribbons for superior quality animals were awarded to Sarah Weinstock and Richard Stoneback. Red ribbons designating excellent quality animals were presented to Alison Scheib, Phoenixville and Mark Meek, Boothwyn.

In the Senior Kid Class Stoneback, Jonathan, Michael, and Joshua Weinstock. In the yearling class (animals over 1 year

old but never freshened) blue ribbons were awarded to Rachel and Sarah Weinstock while red ribbons went to Richard Stoneback and Richard Cathcart, Glen Riddle.

Blue ribbons were won by Edgar and Janet Latshaw, Spring City in Milkers under 2 year old class. In the Milkers 2 to 4 year old class, blue ribbons were presented to Richard Stoneback, Alison Scheib, while red ribbons were presented to Rachel and Sarah Weinstock. Blue ribbons were awarded to Richard Stoneback and Sarah Weinstock in the Milkers 4 years old and older class.

Results in the fitting class, based on members' ability to prepare goats for show: blue ribbons for superior ability were presented to Sarah, Rachel, Jonathan, Michael, and Joshua Weinstock, Janet Latshaw, Alison Scheib, Ricky Cathcart, and Mark Meek. A red ribbon for excellent ability was awarded to Edgar Latshaw.

National 4-H Congress will be the scene for the unveiling of a special photography exhibition. The 1st Annual National 4-H Photography Exhibition will be on display in Chicago throughout the week and will feature photos taken by 4-H members nationwide. The annual exhibition is sponsored by Eastman Kodak Company, the Cooperative Extension Service, National 4-H Foundation and the National 4-H Service Committee. Photos were selected in county and state exhibitions earlier this summer.

In the showmanship class, based on the members' ability to present the goat to the judge, blue ribbons were won by Richard Stoneback and Sarah and Rachel Weinstock. Red ribbons were presented to Edgar and Janet Latshaw, Alison Scheib, Ricky Cathcart, Mark Meek and Joshua, Michael and Jonathan Weinstock.

The Chester County 4-H Goat Show is held annually to evaluate the progress 4-H members make with their goats. This is one of many activities of the Che-Del-Be 4-H Goat Club. In the club, members receive instruction and guidance from Mrs. Margaret Jacob, Pottstown,

Dr. Nancy Risser, Glenn Riddle, and Mrs. Joseph Weinstock, Phoenixville, volunteer adult leaders who donate their time to this activity.

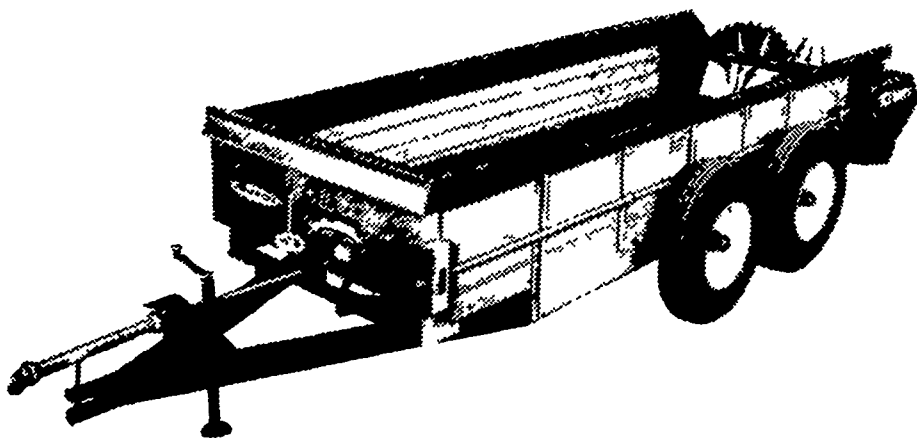
