Consumers' Corner **Bike Safety**

U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission has ordered mandatory safety regulations for all bicycles sold in interstate commerce on or after January 1. 1975. Reports indicate that bikes are the Number 1 product hazard presently—amounting to more than a million injuries a

Injury experts note that in 1973, 419,000 persons sought hospital emergency room treatment for injuries associated with bicycles. The bike craze - for recreational, health and fuel-saving reasons - shows no sign of let-

The Commission notes that about 17% of bike injuries are directly traceable to mechanical and structural defects. 63% are related to loss of control, while 10% are attributable to body en-

tanglements in bike components New bicycle regulations will require that all bicycle frames, steering systems, wheels and brakes will have to meet requirements and pass tests for safe construction, effectiveness, strength, and performance. Wideangle reflectors - front, rear and on the pedals - will also be required Nationwide bicycle education programs are also slated to encourage rider education and inform consumers as to the proper use and maintenance


