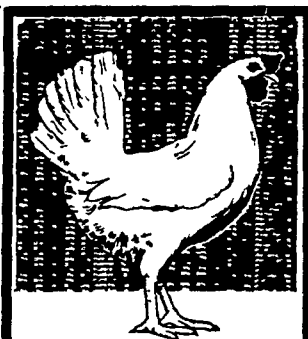
NEST RUN EGGS

Prices are from Egg Clearinghouse, Inc., (ECI) Durham, N.H. and reflect trading prices for gradeable nest run eggs. (GNR) on ECI, a nationwide trading center for producers, packers and marketers. GNR eggs are classified by weight in 30-dozen cases, and traded in lots of either 300 or 750 cases. Prices are FOB buyers dock, and are computed Tuesday and Thursday of each week. Market firmer. Offerings light for good interest. Prices are working higher in several instances. Overall processing activity is light due to light available supplies.

Thursday, October 10
Weekly 51 - CATTLE - Compared with the previous weeks close - closing prices slaughter steers strong to 50 cents higher, heifers steady to 25 cents higher. Cows 50-1.00 lower and bulls fully 1.00 lower.

Four day receipts 17,900 as compared 14,000 previous week and 17,100 a year ago. Slaughter steers approximately 35 percent, heifers short 30 percent, predominance good to Average-Choice, modest supply high-Choice and Prime.

STEERS: Early, nine loads Choice and Prime 1050-1140 lbs. yield grade 3-4 42.00-42.50. At midweek, two loads Choice and Prime 1154-1265 lbs. yield grade 3-4 41.50-42.00, load same grade 1258 lbs. mainly yield grade 4 40.75. Choice 1050-1250 lbs. yield grade 2-4 39.75-41.00, Choice 950-1050 lbs. mainly yield grade 3 39.25-39.75. Mixed Good and Choice 925-1225 lbs. 38.50-39.75. Good 36.50-38.75, yield grade 2-3 Holsteins 36.50-37.75. Standard and low-Good 34.50-36.50.

Average cost slaughter steers this week 39.94 average weight 1099 lbs. as compared 38.54 and 1097 lbs. previous week and 41.63 and 1103 lbs. a year ago.

HEIFERS: High-Choice and Prime 908-1121 lbs. yield grade 3-4 40.50-41.00 early. At midweek, several loads Choice and Prime 950-1115 lbs. yield grade 3-4 40.00. Choice 825-1025 lbs. yield grade 2-4 closed 38.25-39.50, mixed Good and Choice 750-975 lbs. 37.00-38.50. Good 35.00-37.00, small lots standard and Good 33.00-34.50.

Flood Checks Released To Non-Profit Groups

The release of checks totaling \$1,436,760 to non-profit organizations which suffered damage during the floods of September, 1971 and June, 1972 was announced today by Governor Milton J. Shapp.

The payments made today went to 32 of the 140 applicants for the program. All remaining checks will be mailed out by the end of November.

The \$5 million program, known as Act 159, was passed by the General Assembly and signed into law by Shapp last January. It authorizes state aid to nonprofit organizations damaged in the floods of

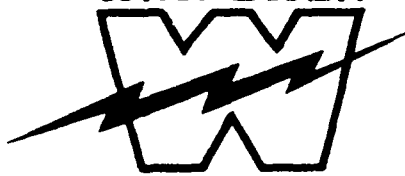

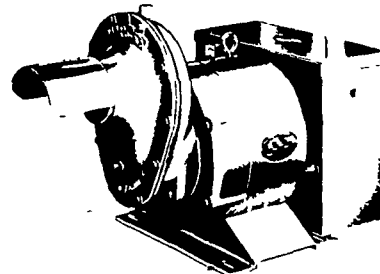
