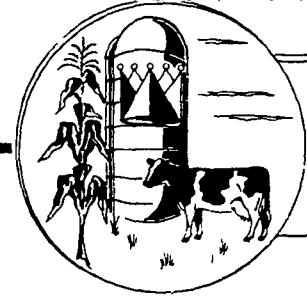
Hitz Receives Farmer Degree

Boyd M. Hitz of Annville received the American Farmer Degree recently at special ceremonies held during the 47th National Convention of the Future Farmers of America, in Kansas City, Mo. He was one of 643 FFA members selected to receive the American Farmer Degree, highest degree of membership in the FFA. As a holder of the American Farmer Degree, he joins a select group representing about one percent of all FFA members.

The American Farmer Degree is presented only by the National Organization of the Future Farmers of America to members who have demonstrated exceptional agricultural and leadership ability. The 643 members awarded the American Farmer Degree represent the highest achievement of more than 465,000 FFA members now enrolled in the nation's 7,726 high school vocational agriculture departments.

By February they dropped in production by 1 pound of milk per cow per day.
