The Senate Republican Leader said he has been advised by Senator John L. McClellan (D-Ark.), Chairman of the Subcommittee on Criminal Laws and Procedures of the Senate Judiciary Committee, that lottery hearings have been scheduled for November 20 and 21. Senator Scott will be chairman for part of the hearings.

Senator McClellan advised Scott of hearing dates in a letter responding to his October 3 letter urging hearings this session to avert the possible closing of the Pennsylvania State Lottery, which benefits senior

citizens. Both Scott and Senator Richard S. Schweiker (R-Pa.) have been pressing for action to halt the possible shutdown, which Scott said would be "extremely unfortunate."

"It is essential for early action to prevent the closing of our Pennsylvania Lottery for ever a short period of time because of its great benefit to our elderly citizens," Scott said. "I am pleased Senator McClellan has agreed this problem is urgent and I am delighted to cooperate in the upcoming hearings in any way I can.'
