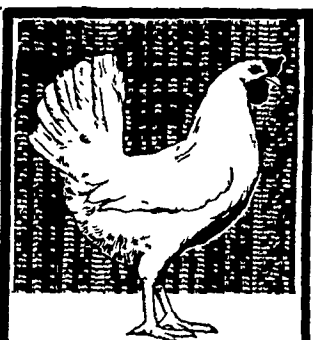
NEST RUN EGGS

Prices are from Egg Clearinghouse, Inc., (ECI) Durham, N.H. and reflect trading prices for gradeable nest run eggs (GNR) on ECI, a nationwide trading center for producers, packers and marketers. GNR eggs are classified by weight in 30-dozen cases, and traded in lots of either 300 or 750 cases. Prices are FOB buyers dock, and are computed Tuesday and Thursday of each week. 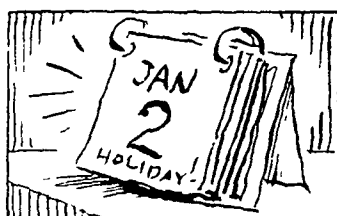

Champion bull honors went to Millborn Farm, Sherborn, Massachusetts, and Powisset Farm, Dover, Massachusetts, on MBF L1 Domino 195, by WCF L1 Domino 095 and out of a BBH Rebel Lass 18 cow. The spring yearling entry weighed 1,440 pounds with a 2.46 W-DA.

Champion female honors went to Millborn's spring yearling entry, MBF L1 Miss Dom 194, by the "093" and out of GV Real Princess 101. She weighed 1,075 with a 1.83 W-DA.

Reserve bull, a two-year-old, went to ABC Ranch, Canisteo, New York, on LHR L1 Domino 287, by L1 CL3 Domino 68531, weighing 1,690 with a 1.83 W-DA. ABC also captured the reserve female honors on their second-place spring yearling entry, Empire Linette 1 by CL 1 Domino 904. She weighed 1,035 with a 1.81 W-DA.

Millborn dominated the group classes, taking all the first-place ribbons in two bulls, pair-of-yearlings, pair-of-calves, best six head, and the coveted get-of-sire on the get of WCF L1 Domino 095.

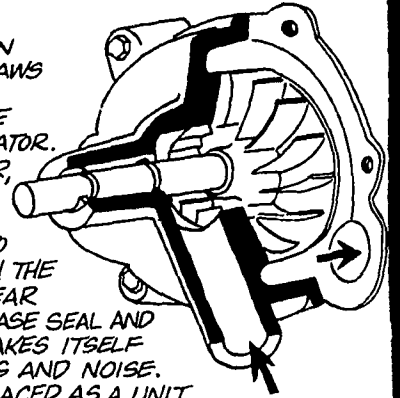

WATER PUMP— POWERED BY THE FAN SHAFT, THE PUMP DRAWS COOLANT INTO ITS CHAMBER FROM THE BOTTOM OF THE RADIATOR. THERE THE IMPELLER, A WHIRLING SERIES OF VANES, FORCES OUT THE COOLANT TO CIRCULATE THROUGH THE WATER JACKET. WEAR OCCURRING IN A GREASE SEAL AND SHAFT BEARING MAKES ITSELF KNOWN BY LEAKING AND NOISE. THE PUMP IS REPLACED AS A UNIT
