The Antibiotic Problem
All too often I get the question: "what do I do with a tank of rejected milk?" It's tough to be shut off from the dairy for the required number of days because some of your milk reacted to the antibiotic sensitivity test. But can you really ask for any pity under the circumstances?

State and Federal Departments of Agriculture and the U.S. Food and Drug Administration are expressing concern about an increasing incidence of antibiotic residues in milk and carcasses of slaughtered cows.

I have to agree with Dr. Sam Guss, our Extension Veterinarian, that the answer to herd mastitis problems is not the use of antibiotics. True, antibiotics are able to check the growth
