

# Report From Pa. Jr. Holstein Meet Lapp Honored

The Pennsylvania Junior Holstein Association held its annual convention at the Pocono Manor Inn on November 21-22.

The annual business meeting was held Friday, November 22. Under old business, a resolution to change the bylaws which was presented last year was voted on and passed. It reads as follows:

1. At the Annual Meeting of the Pennsylvania Jr. Holstein Ass'n. caucuses of each convention district, as defined in Article IX, will elect two Jr. Executive Committee members from their district. Terms of Jr. Executive Committee members will be one year. Jr. Executive Committee members will be eligible to serve only two terms.

2. The Junior Executive Committee will, at a reorganizational meeting immediately following their election at the annual meeting, elect officers as provided for in Article VII. Article VII, Section 2, shall be defined to mean that terms of officers will be one year, and that they will be

eligible to succeed themselves only once.

Under new business, the junior membership regulations were reviewed. Anyone between the ages of 9 and 21, and who owns at least one Registered Holstein is eligible for junior membership in the Holstein-Friesian Association of America. Junior members have the same privileges as senior members except voting. Starting January 1, 1975 there will be a two dollar membership fee. So anyone who is not a member is encouraged to join soon. Junior membership applications are available from officers of your County Junior Holstein Club or the Pennsylvania Holstein Association, 839 Benner Pike, State College, Pa. 16801. The Lancaster County Junior Holstein Club will meet on January 16, 1975 at 8:00 p.m. at the Farm and Home Center. All junior members or anyone interested in becoming a junior member is invited to attend.

Chairperson went over recommendations of the Youth Committee. A motion to sell windbreaker jackets, as a money making project, was voted on and passed. Final details on the jackets are being worked out. They will be nylon windbreaker type jackets, either lined or unlined, and will have the Pennsylvania Registered Holstein emblem on the front. These jackets will be on display at the Holstein booth at the Pennsylvania Farm Show in January and orders will be taken at that time.
