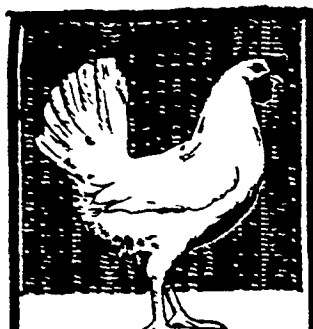

Ready to cook movement spotty ranging light to occasionally good for weekend needs. Slaughter schedules reduced as occasional additional plant not operating today. Today's less than trucklot asking prices trended higher within unchanged ranges on both Plant and US Grade A. Advance interest good at generally two cents higher than this week's levels. Live supplies adequate at weights in a wide but generally satisfactory range. Undertone fully steady to firm. Negotiated trucklot prices 2-3 lb ready to cook broiler-fryers for delivery next week: US Grade A - none; Plant Grade - 43-44.

Current broiler-fryer negotiated prices for immediate delivery mostly multiple-drop shipments to New York City from Delmarva.

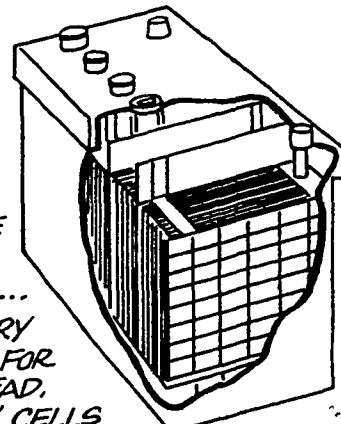
