Wayne Introduces Feed Mate Mixes

The Wayne Feed Division of Allied Mills, Inc., has introduced the Wayne Grain-and Roughage-Mate feeds to help dairy, hog and cattle feeders utilize their limited feed supplies efficiently.

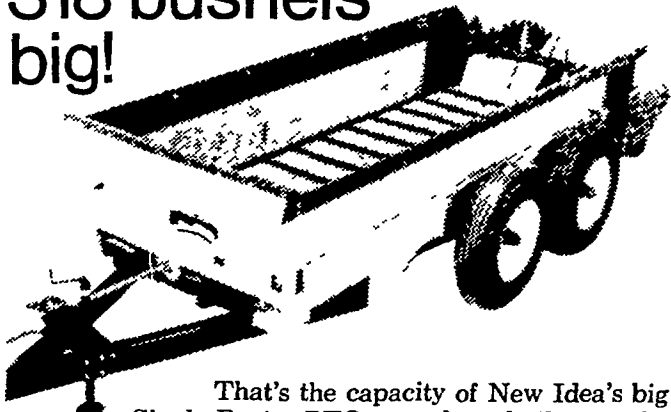

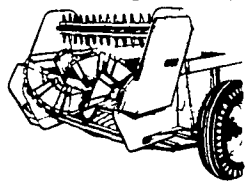

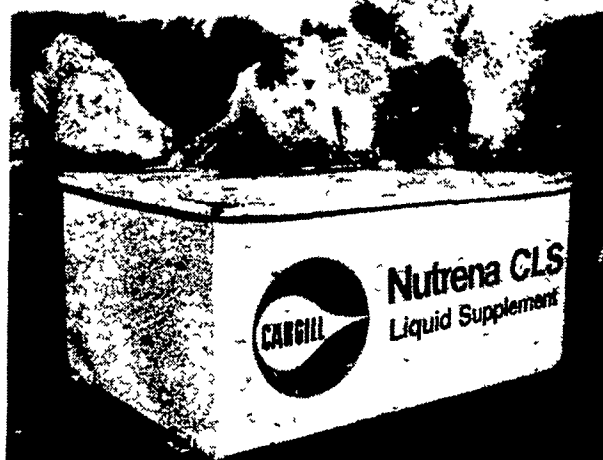
