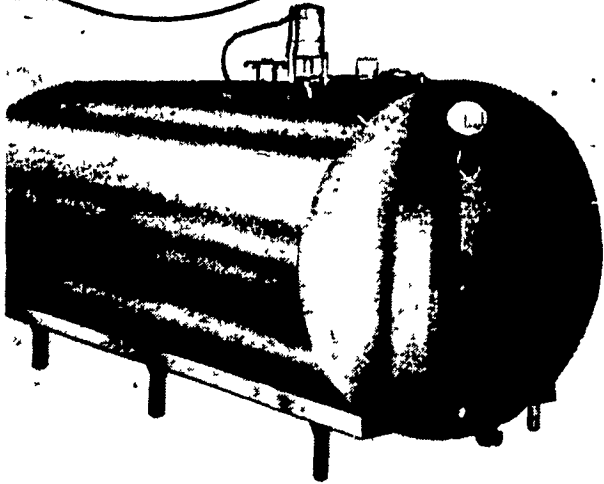
go to baking school for professional training. However she would also like to be a practical nurse. "I've also always wanted to be a nurse and although I do want to eventually be a baker, I
