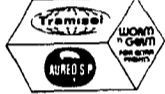

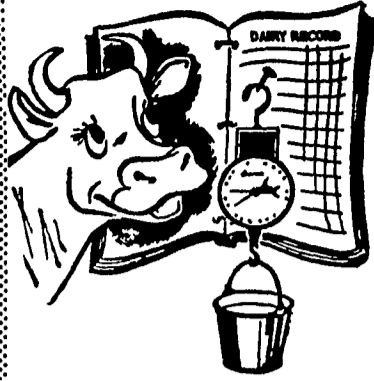

A cow in the herd of Clarence Mase had the highest lactation record for the month of November. Daisy produced 827 pounds of butterfat, 20,505 pounds of milk and had a 4.0 percent test.

Second high in production was a cow owned by M. Luther Bennetch. She produced 815 pounds of milk with 18,199 pounds of milk and had a 4.5 percent test.

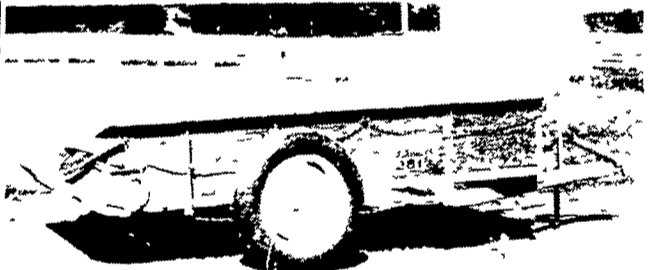

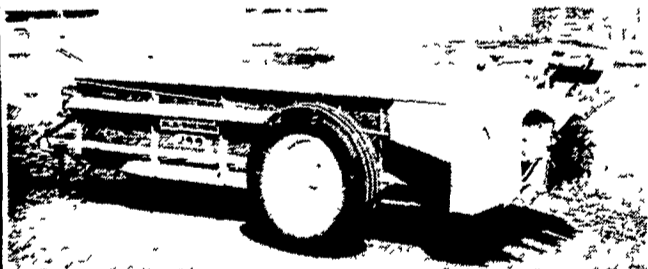

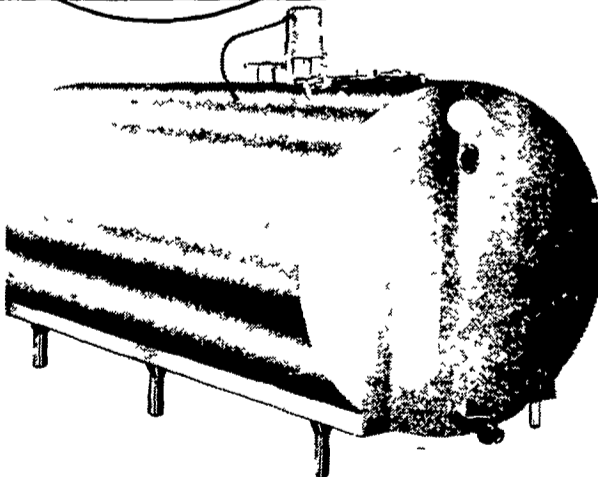
