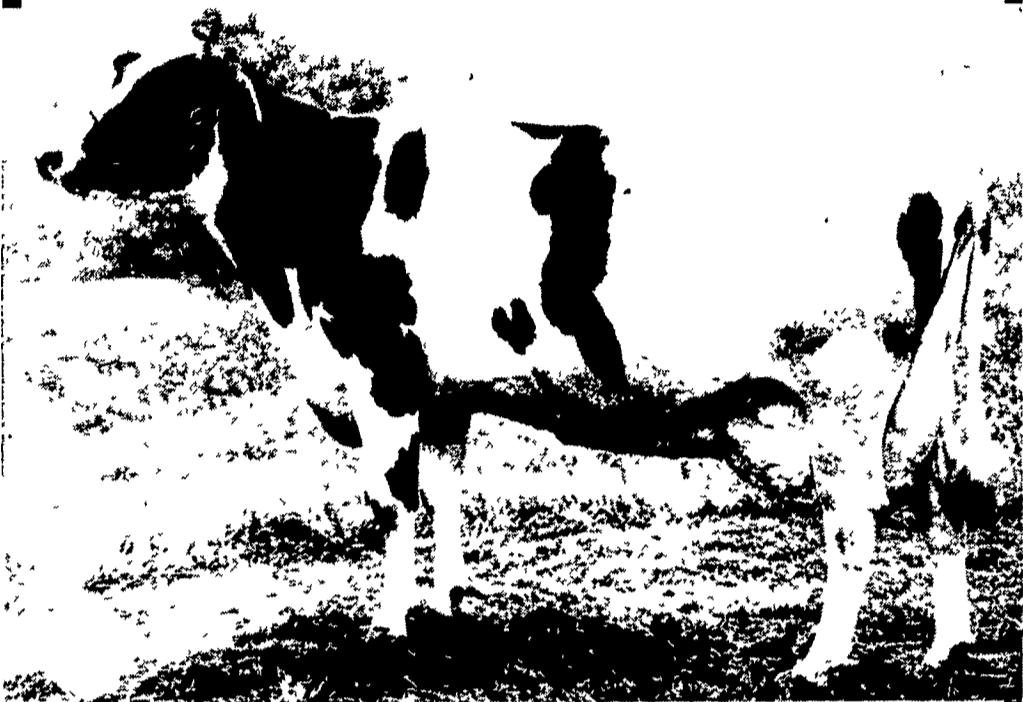

been involved in many county judging contests and has been a cooperative scholar traveling to the PAFC conferences at Shippensburg State College.

Gordon has been on the livestock judging team and traveled to Kansas City to compete at the National FFA conference. He has also entered the FFA tractor driving contests and this year placed first in the area.

Gordon's main FFA project has been in the field of dairy. He presently owns 4 registered Holstein cows and 2 heifers and is a member of the Jr. Holstein Club.

When asked how he would change FFA if possible, Gordon explained that he would like to tell more people about FFA and its activities.

"Many people just don't know what FFA is all about," he stated. "I think we need to give it a new image and let others know about the work and activities we get involved in."

"FFA is a good organization and besides giving you responsibility it makes you proud of your accomplishments."

Gordon certainly has much to be proud of with all the responsibility he has taken on over the past few years. For along with his farm related activities he is also a student leader in school and was a varsity wrestler.

Gordon is planning to go on to college and study Dairy Science but for the moment he is concentrating on completing his senior year at Pequea Valley.

During the Farm Show, to be held in January, Gordon will be receiving the Keystone Farming Degree, significant of the work and responsibility he has taken on during the past four years in FFA.

Youths Learn "Art" of Breadmaking in 4-H

Nothing is more satisfying than the aroma of a freshly baked loaf of bread, or basket of rolls, or of pastries. Over 715,000 boys and girls receive that satisfaction when they prepare tasty, delicious bread dishes as part of their activities in the national 4-H bread program.

Sponsored by Standard Brands Incorporated, these youthful bakers create tasty, nutritious bread dishes that excite their family, friends and neighbors. The youths know that bread is an important part of the 4-4-3-2 daily formula for good nutrition—four servings of bread and cereal, four of fruits and vegetables, three of milk and two of meat.

Supervised by the Cooperative Extension Service, 4-H'ers in the bread program give demonstrations on breadmaking to other youths and adults in their community. They are also eligible for awards provided by Standard Brands. The company offers up to four medals of honor for county winners and an

expense-paid trip to National 4-H Congress in Chicago, Dec. 1-5 for a top winner in each state.

At the annual 4-H event, six national winners will be announced with each receiving \$700 educational scholarships, courtesy of the company.

One such national winner, last year, was reluctant to enter the program. Ann Gurney of Cheshire, Mass. was astounded when her mother first suggested she enroll in the 4-H bread program. "Breadbaking, I thought, was something people did in the old days", said the 18-year-old Miss.

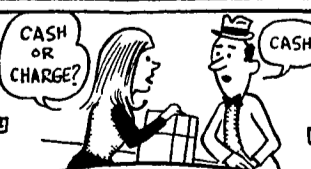
"But", she added, "I decided to give it a try".

Some nine years later, Miss Gurney points to more than 150 blue ribbons for bread and other foods exhibits. Last year, alone, she prepared more than 200 yeast bread products. She has given numerous bread demonstrations and headed the food department of the Berkshire County 4-H Fair.

Across the country in Wyoming, Nalene Robinson, 18, of Bedford, has been baking foreign breads using recipes handed down by her grandmother. She also has found bread and other baked foods an appreciated gift by friends, neighbors and shut-ins, especially at holiday time.
