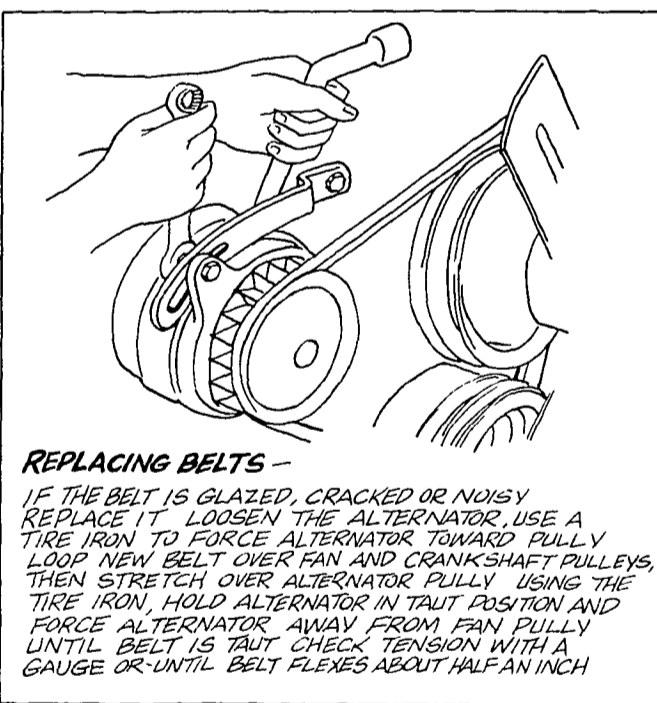

Automobile Service Tips



REPLACING BELTS —

IF THE BELT IS GLAZED, CRACKED OR NOISY REPLACE IT. LOOSEN THE ALTERNATOR, USE A TIRE IRON TO FORCE ALTERNATOR TOWARD PULLEY. LOOP NEW BELT OVER FAN AND CRANKSHAFT PULLEYS, THEN STRETCH OVER ALTERNATOR PULLEY USING THE TIRE IRON, HOLD ALTERNATOR IN TAUT POSITION AND FORCE ALTERNATOR AWAY FROM FAN PULLEY UNTIL BELT IS TAUT. CHECK TENSION WITH A GAUGE OR UNTIL BELT FLEXES ABOUT HALF AN INCH.
