Prices are from Egg Clearinghouse, Inc., (ECI) Durham, N.H. and reflect trading prices for gradeable nest run eggs (GNR) on ECI, a nationwide trading center for producers, packers and marketers. GNR eggs are classified by weight in 30-dozen cases, and traded in lots of either 300 or 750 cases. Prices are FOB buyers dock, and are computed Tuesday and Thursday of each week. Moderate supplies of fresh meat clearing at a moderate pace; however, Beef sellers under pressure through inability to keep fully in line with uptrends for replacement Beef stocks, as retailers indicating no urgency for Beef in general.
